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## SENATE BILL No. 573

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DIGEST OF SB 573 (Updated February 13, 2013 3:33 pm - DI 110)

**Citations Affected:** IC 25-21.8; IC 35-51.

**Synopsis:** Massage therapists. Provides that an individual must be licensed by the state board of massage therapy to engage in the practice of massage therapy. (Under current law, massage therapists are certified by the board but certification is not required for the practice of massage therapy.) Makes it a Class B misdemeanor to practice massage therapy without a license. Provides that the massage therapy licensing requirements do not apply to a health care provider who is acting within the scope of the health care provider's license, registration, or certificate. Provides that the massage therapist licensing law preempts local ordinances, resolutions, rules, and policies concerning massage therapists except for zoning requirements and occupational license fees. Makes conforming changes.

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## SENATE BILL No. 573

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning professions and occupations.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:*

- 1 SECTION 1. IC 25-21.8-1-5, AS ADDED BY P.L.200-2007,  
2 SECTION 8, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE  
3 JULY 1, 2013]: Sec. 5. "Massage therapist" means an individual who  
4 **is licensed under this article and** practices massage therapy.
- 5 SECTION 2. IC 25-21.8-2-2, AS ADDED BY P.L.200-2007,  
6 SECTION 8, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE  
7 JULY 1, 2013]: Sec. 2. ~~(a)~~ The board consists of five (5) members  
8 appointed by the governor as follows:  
9 (1) Three (3) massage therapists, each of whom:  
10 (A) is ~~certified~~ **licensed** under this article; and  
11 (B) has been actively practicing massage therapy for at least  
12 three (3) of the five (5) years immediately preceding the  
13 individual's appointment.  
14 (2) Two (2) members of the general public. A board member  
15 appointed under this subdivision must not:  
16 (A) be ~~certified~~ **licensed** under this article;  
17 (B) be the spouse of an individual who is ~~certified~~ **licensed** or

- 2 (C) have a direct or an indirect financial interest in the

- 14 **that:**
- 15 (1) ~~regarding~~ **establish** standards for the competent practice of
- 16 massage therapy **and continuing education for massage**
- 17 **therapists; and**
- 18 (2) **are necessary for the administration and enforcement of**
- 19 **this article.**
- 20 SECTION 4. IC 25-21.8-3-1, AS ADDED BY P.L.200-2007,
- 21 SECTION 8, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
- 22 JULY 1, 2013]: Sec. 1. (a) The board shall do the following:
- 23 (1) Administer and enforce this article.
- 24 (2) Adopt rules under IC 4-22-2 for the administration and
- 25 enforcement of this article.
- 26 (3) Judge the qualifications of applicants for ~~certification~~
- 27 **licensure** under this article.
- 28 (4) Issue, deny, or renew ~~certifications~~ **licenses** under this article.
- 29 (5) Subject to IC 4-21.5, IC 25-1-7, and IC 25-1-11, discipline
- 30 individuals who are ~~certified~~ **licensed** under this article for
- 31 violations of this article.
- 32 (6) Establish reasonable fees for examination, ~~certification~~ **license**
- 33 applications, renewal of ~~certifications;~~ **licenses,** and other
- 34 services.
- 35 (7) Maintain a record of all proceedings.
- 36 (8) Maintain records of ~~certified~~ **licensed** massage therapists.
- 37 (9) Adopt at least two (2) examinations that an applicant may use
- 38 for ~~certification~~ **licensure** under this article.
- 39 (b) The board may do the following:
- 40 (1) Conduct administrative hearings.
- 41 (2) Administer oaths in matters relating to the discharge of the
- 42 official duties of the board.

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**(3) Approve massage therapy school curricula consistent with accepted national educational standards.**

SECTION 5. IC 25-21.8-4-0.5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE AS A **NEW** SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2013]: **Sec. 0.5. This article does not apply to a health care provider who is acting within the scope of the health care provider's license, registration, or certificate.**

SECTION 6. IC 25-21.8-4-1, AS ADDED BY P.L.200-2007, SECTION 8, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2013]: Sec. 1. An application for a massage therapist ~~certification~~ **license** must be:

- (1) made to the board in the form and manner provided by the board; and
- (2) accompanied by an application fee in the amount set by the board.

SECTION 7. IC 25-21.8-4-2, AS AMENDED BY P.L.107-2012, SECTION 62, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2013]: Sec. 2. An individual who applies for ~~certification~~ **licensure** as a massage therapist must do the following:

- (1) Furnish evidence satisfactory to the board showing that the individual:
  - (A) is at least eighteen (18) years of age;
  - (B) has a high school diploma or the equivalent of a high school diploma;
  - (C) has successfully completed a massage therapy school or program that:
    - (i) requires at least five hundred (500) hours of supervised classroom and hands on instruction on massage therapy;
    - (ii) is in good standing with a state, regional, or national agency of government charged with regulating massage therapy schools or programs; and
    - (iii) is accredited by the state workforce innovation council under IC 22-4.1-21 or accredited by another state where the standards for massage therapy education are substantially the same as the standards in Indiana, or is a program at an institution of higher learning that is approved by the board; and
  - (D) has taken and passed a ~~certification~~ **an** examination approved by the board.
- (2) Provide a history of any criminal convictions the individual has, including any convictions related to the practice of the profession. The board shall deny an application for ~~certification~~

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- 1           **licensure** if the applicant:
- 2           (A) has been convicted of:
- 3           (i) prostitution;
- 4           (ii) rape; or
- 5           (iii) sexual misconduct; or
- 6           (B) is a registered sex offender.
- 7           (3) Provide proof that the applicant has professional liability
- 8           insurance in force that lists the state as an additional insured.
- 9           (4) Verify the information submitted on the application form.
- 10          (5) Pay fees established by the board.

11          SECTION 8. IC 25-21.8-4-3, AS ADDED BY P.L.200-2007,  
 12          SECTION 8, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE  
 13          JULY 1, 2013]: Sec. 3. **(a) It is unlawful for** an individual who is not  
 14          **certified licensed** under this article ~~may not~~ **to:**

- 15          **(1) engage in the practice of massage therapy;**
- 16          ~~(2)~~ **(2) profess to be a certified licensed** massage therapist; or
- 17          ~~(3)~~ **(3) use:**
- 18           (A) the title "~~Certified Massage Therapist~~" "**Licensed**
- 19           **Massage Therapist**", or "Massage Therapist", "**Licensed**
- 20           **Massage Practitioner**", "**Massage Practitioner**",

- 23           (B) the abbreviation "~~CMT~~" "**LMT**", or "**MT**", or "**LMP**"; or
- 24           **(C) other words, initials, letters, abbreviations, or insignia**
- 25           **indicating or implying that to imply the person individual is**
- 26           **a certified licensed** massage therapist.

27          **(b) A person who knowingly or intentionally violates this section**  
 28          **commits a Class B misdemeanor.**

29          SECTION 9. IC 25-21.8-4-4, AS ADDED BY P.L.177-2009,  
 30          SECTION 39, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE  
 31          JULY 1, 2013]: Sec. 4. A massage therapist who is ~~certified licensed~~  
 32          under this article shall provide proof of ~~certification~~ **licensure** when  
 33          practicing massage therapy.

34          SECTION 10. IC 25-21.8-4-5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA  
 35          CODE AS A **NEW** SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS  
 36          [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2013]: Sec. 5. **(a) The board may classify a**  
 37          **license as inactive if the board receives written notification from a**  
 38          **licensed massage therapist stating that the licensed massage**  
 39          **therapist will not practice in Indiana.**

40          **(b) The board may reissue a license to a holder of an inactive**  
 41          **license if the applicant:**

- 42          **(1) pays a reactivation fee set by the board; and**

3 (c) The board shall adopt rules under IC 4-22-2 to implement

5 SECTION 11. IC 25-21.8-4-6 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA

7 [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2013]: Sec. 6. (a) If an individual is certified  
8 as a massage therapist on June 30, 2013, under this article:

9 (1) the individual is considered to be licensed as a massage  
10 therapist on July 1, 2013; and

11 (2) the state board of massage therapy established by  
12 IC 25-21.8-2-1 shall issue a license to the individual under this  
13 article.

14 (b) Notwithstanding subsection (a), the state board of massage  
15 therapy and the Indiana professional licensing agency are not  
16 required to issue:

17 (1) a wall license to an individual described in subsection (a);

19 (2) a new pocket license to an individual described in  
20 subsection (a);

21 until the license renewal period beginning December 1, 2013.

23 SECTION 12. IC 25-21.8-4-7 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA

25 [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2013]: Sec. 7. (a) A person duly licensed,  
26 certified, or registered in another state or territory, the District of  
27 Columbia, or a foreign country, when in Indiana to provide service

28 as a part of an emergency response team working in conjunction  
29 with disaster relief officials, may practice massage therapy without  
30 an Indiana license. The ability to practice under this subsection  
31 lasts only for the duration of the emergency or disaster.

32 (b) A person duly licensed, certified, or registered in another  
33 state or territory, the District of Columbia, or a foreign country,  
34 when in Indiana to provide service as part of a charity,  
35 educational, or athletic event, may practice massage therapy  
36 without an Indiana license. Persons practicing under this  
37 subsection may practice only for the period of time the event is  
38 taking place.

39 (c) A student practicing massage therapy while enrolled in a  
40 program recognized by the board and completing a clinical  
41 requirement for graduation may practice massage therapy without  
42 a license. If a student is practicing massage therapy under this

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1 subsection, the school or other entity supervising the student may  
2 receive reimbursement for the services performed by the student.  
3 The student may not receive compensation for performing services.

28 **(d) The board may grant a license by endorsement to a massage**  
29 **therapist who is licensed or certified and in good standing in**
