A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LABOR.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 371, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated		
3	and to read as follows:		
4	"§371- National Human Trafficking Resource Center		
5	hotline; posting requirement; penalty. (a) An establishment		
6	shall post in a conspicuous place near the establishment's		
7	primary public entrance or another area where posters and		
8	notices are customarily posted on the premises of the		
9	establishment, a poster no smaller than eight and one-half		
10	inches by eleven inches in size that states the following:		
11	"If you or someone you know is being forced to engage in		
12	any activity and cannot leave - whether it is commercial		
13	sex, housework, farm work, or any other similar activity -		
14	call the National Human Trafficking Resource Center Hotline		
15	at 1-888-373-7888 to access help and services.		
16	Victims of human trafficking are protected under United		
17	States and Hawaii law.

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1	(1)	Available twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week;
2	(2)	Toll free;
3	(3)	Operated by a non-profit, non-governmental
4		organization;
5	(4)	Anonymous and confidential;
6	(5)	Accessible in one hundred seventy languages; and
7	(6)	Able to provide help, referral to services, training,
8		and general information."
9	<u>(b)</u>	For purposes of this section, "establishment" means:
10	(1)	Any entity that holds a class 5 or class 11 liquor
11		license pursuant to section 281-31;
12	(2)	A hospital emergency room;
13	(3)	A massage therapy establishment; or
14	(4)	A farm operation employing five or more persons.
15	(c)	A poster required under subsection (a) shall be
16	printed i	n English.
17	(b)	The department shall make available on its public
18	website a	n electronic version of the poster required by
19	subsection	n (a) for establishments to print.
20	(e)	Any establishment or any agency, employee, or
21	represent	ative thereof who wilfully and knowingly fails,
22	neglects,	or refuses to perform any act required by this section



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1	shall be fined not more than \$100 for each separate offense.
2	Each day the violation continues shall constitute a separate
3	offense. Any action taken to impose or collect the penalty
4	provided for in this subsection shall be considered a civil
5	action."

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Requires certain establishments to post in a conspicuous place a poster that provides specified information relating to human trafficking and the National Human Trafficking Resource Center hotline. Defines "establishment". Establishes penalties for violations of the poster requirement.

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
